- To promote the principles and practices of sustainable development within your communities.
- To enhance knowledge and understanding of the impacts of climate change on rural areas and to explore applicable solutions.
- To develop practical skills for planning and implementing climate actions.
- To encourage intercultural exchange and cooperation among young people from different European rural areas.

Why this project? Rural areas are vulnerable to the effects of climate change. Young people like you, with new ideas and energy, are key to driving change and building a sustainable future. Your engagement can make a real difference.

The Venue: Đurđevac, Croatia

Welcome to Đurđevac, a town in the Podravina region of Croatia.

About Đurđevac

Đurđevac is located in northwestern Croatia. It is known for its history, cultural heritage, and natural surroundings.

The Legend of the Picoks: The town's most famous story is about the local population's clever defence during a siege. The "Picokijada" festival celebrates this legend annually.

Đurđevac Sands ("Croatian Sahara"): A protected geographical-botanical reserve, this is a remnant of a desert with unique vegetation. It will serve as an inspiration for our environmental themes.

Đurđevac Old Town: A medieval fortress that now houses a museum and art galleries.

Đurđevac provides a calm environment for our youth exchange.





Accommodation & Meals

Venue: Hostel Borik, located in Borik park-forest.

Preparatory Visit (APV) 15th - 18th September 2025

Accommodation: 12 persons

Participants will be accommodated in two separate dormitories (6 people in each),

separated by gender.

Meals

The meal plan starts with dinner on Monday, 15th September.
Full board (breakfast, lunch, dinner) will be provided on Tuesday, 16th and Wednesday,
17th September.

The meal plan ends with breakfast on Thursday, 18th September.





Accommodation & Meals

Venue: Hostel Borik, located in Borik park-forest.

Youth Exchange (YE) 7th - 15th October 2025

Accommodation: 35 people.

Accommodation will be arranged in a mix of rooms: one twin room (2 people), one triple room (3 people), and two larger dormitories (15 people in each). Room arrangements will be finalised closer to the date.

Meals


The meal plan starts with dinner on Tuesday, 7th October.
Full board will be provided every day from Wednesday, 8th October to Tuesday, 14th
October.

The meal plan ends with breakfast on Wednesday, 15th October.

Dietary needs: It is important that you inform us of any specific dietary needs (allergies, intolerances, vegetarianism, veganism, etc.) through your group leader, so we can arrange appropriate meals.







Travel Logistics

General instructions

Please start planning your journey as soon as possible. Your group leader will assist you in organising your travel.

Important: All tickets must be **approved by SUMA before purchase** to ensure they comply with the project rules.

Green Travel:

We encourage using environmentally friendly transport like trains and buses. Green travel is strongly recommended for participants from: Croatia, Romania, Italy, Belgium, and Slovenia.

Travel Cost Reimbursement

Travel costs will be reimbursed up to the maximum amount set by the Erasmus+ distance calculator.

Croatia: up to €56 (green travel)

Romania: up to €417 (green travel)

Italy: up to €285 (green travel)

France: up to €309

Cyprus: up to €309

Belgium: up to €417 (green travel)

Slovenia: up to €285 (green travel)





Required documents for reimbursement (KEEP ALL ORIGINALS)

Original tickets (plane, bus, train).
Invoices/receipts.
Boarding passes for all flights.
Proof of payment (e.g., bank statement).

Reimbursement will be made by bank transfer after the project, upon receipt of all correct documents.

How to reach Đurđevac

The nearest major airport is Zagreb (ZAG).
From Zagreb, you can reach Đurđevac by train or bus. The journey takes approximately 2-2.5 hours.

Activity Schedule

Main Project Activities

1.Preparatory Visit (APV)

Dates: 15th - 18th September 2025.

Arrival: Monday, 15th September (afternoon).

Departure: Thursday, 18th September (morning).

Who: 1 group leader + 1 young participant from each partner country.

2. Youth Exchange (YE)

Dates: 7th - 15th October 2025.

oArrival: Tuesday, 7th October (afternoon).

Departure: Wednesday, 15th October (morning).

Activity Days: Wednesday, 8th Oct - Tuesday, 14th Oct (7 full days).

Who: 4 young participants + 1 group leader per country.

Note: A detailed schedule will be provided before each activity. The programme is subject to minor adjustments







Preparation Before Arrival



To make the most of the exchange, please prepare the following: 1."Local profiles" of your rural community

Research and prepare a short profile of your rural area. Include its geography, specific climate challenges, and any local environmental initiatives. This will be used in our workshops.

2.Preparation for "Rural mosaic" (intercultural evenings)

Each national group will prepare one evening to present their country and rural culture.

You can bring traditional food/drink, music, stories, photos, or small local products.

Coordinate within your national team.

3.English language

The working language is English. Please be prepared to participate in discussions. We will provide a "Climate glossary" of key terms to help you.

4.What to bring (Packing list)

Comfortable clothes suitable for October weather in Croatia (layers are recommended, include a jacket and a raincoat).

Comfortable walking shoes and sports shoes.

Personal hygiene items and any personal medication.

A reusable water bottle.

A power adapter if needed (Croatia uses Type F sockets, 230V).

A notebook and pen.

5.Currency

The official currency in Croatia is the EURO (€).





Health and Safety

Your well-being is our priority.

European Health Insurance Card (EHIC). This is mandatory for all participants from EU/EEA countries. It provides access to necessary state-provided healthcare. Please check that your card is valid.

Travel insurance. We strongly recommend that all participants take out additional travel insurance. This can cover a wider range of situations, such as private healthcare, lost luggage, or travel cancellation.

Code of conduct. We expect all participants to behave responsibly and with respect for others. A Code of Conduct will be presented and agreed upon on the first day to ensure a safe environment for everyone.

Safety during activities. All activities will be led by experienced facilitators. Please follow their instructions, especially during outdoor activities.

Emergency contacts. A list of important numbers (emergency services, SUMA team contacts) will be provided to you.





What Happens After the Project? (Follow-up)

Our engagement does not end with the youth exchange.

- **1.Online campaign with your video messages.** The videos you create will be shared on social media to raise awareness and inspire other young people. We will use the hashtag #RuralYouth4Climate.
- 2. Publication on youth work methods. We will create a handbook detailing the non-formal methods used during the exchange. Your experiences will be included, and the publication will be a public resource for other youth workers and organisations.
- **3. Applying what you've learned in your communities.** We encourage you to use the knowledge and skills from this project to start your own local activities. SUMA and its partners will be available to offer support.
- **4. Stay connected.** Keep in touch with other participants and the partner organisations. This network can be a source for future projects and collaborations.
